### I. The Importance of Church Membership

- A. The Bible suggests records were kept in the early church. (Acts 1:15; 2:41)
- B. The Biblical example is a Christian attached to a local church.
- C. Today, many Christians minimize church membership but membership does several things:
  - 1. Assures common doctrinal belief - Doctrine is paramount!
  - 2. Promotes unity of believers – Christians with common beliefs and practices can serve God and minister together in unity.
  - 3. Provides accountability (Galatians 6:1; Matthew 18:15-17)
  - 4. Provides numerous opportunities to serve

### III. The Expectations with Church Membership

- A. What you may expect from Community Baptist Church
  - 1. Christ-honoring services with Biblically-sound preaching and teaching
  - 2. Ministry in time of need
  - 3. Financial and moral integrity in leadership
  - 4. Warm, loving environment
- B. What Community Baptist Church expects from you
  - 1. Regular attendance at the services.
    - a. God commands our faithfulness. (Hebrews 10:25)
    - b. Each of our services has a specific purpose.
      - (1) Sunday morning: Worship and Evangelism
      - (2) Sunday evening: Discipleship and Christian growth
      - (3) Wednesday evening: Prayer and Bible study
    - c. Many people join churches and take a casual approach to attendance. We expect our members to attend

regularly.

- (1) Members who do not attend regularly do not grow spiritually.
- (2) Members who do not attend regularly are disobedient believers. (Hebrews 10:25)

- 2. Invite others to church.  
\*80% of those who visit a church do so because of a friend, relative, associate, or neighbor.

- a. When the formerly unchurched were asked the question, “Which person was the greatest influence in your coming to Church?” 2% said merchant, 6 % said neighbor, 8% said coworker, 17% said other, 25% said no one, but 43% said family member.
  - b. Out of the 43% that came to Christ through the influence of a family member, 2% was due to the witness of a parent-in-law, 5% through siblings, 9% through parents, 9% through other family members, 18% through children, and 35% through wives.
  - c. “The most receptive unchurched group is living in the homes of those already active in our churches.” (Rainer, pp. 49-50)
3. Participate in the ministry
    - a. We offer many opportunities for your spiritual growth and involvement.
      - (1) Regular services
      - (2) Weekly visitation
      - (3) Discipleship of new converts
      - (4) Evangelism training
      - (5) Music (choir, vocal and instrumental specials, offertory, etc.)
      - (6) Kids/Youth ministry
      - (7) Ladies’/Men’s ministries
      - (8) Usher/Greeter
      - (9) Weekly set-up/take down
      - (9) Technical/Computer support
      - (10) Special events (Family Fun Fest; Canvassing, Christmas Program, etc.)
    - b. We strongly urge you to get involved in ministry.
      - (1) This is key to your being assimilated into the church and developing relationships!
      - (2) You get out of church what you put into church.
      - (3) Come to church ready to serve!
  4. Give
    - a. This is God’s plan for the local church. I Corinthians 16:1-3
    - b. This is God’s plan for blessing in the believer’s life. Lk 6:38
- C. How you can experience God’s best in your new church home.
1. Develop a quiet time with God each day.
  2. Develop relationships with others in the church.
  3. Attend the worship services.
  4. Support the ministry through your tithes and offerings.
  5. Find a ministry in which you can serve and get involved.
